Touching lives, moulding future

A SEMINAR ON 'COMPREHENSIVE MATHEMATICS' AT IIT GUWAHATI



It was Stephen Hawking who said "Mathematics is not just the study of numbers. It is the study of bounding and comprehending what cannot be bounded and comprehended." It was in pursuit of comprehension that on the 28th of October 2017, a group of forty-five selected students from Classes VI to X made a visit to the Indian Institute of Technology, Guwahati to attend a seminar on Mathematics organized by the Outreach Department of IITG. It was held at the renowned Lecture Hall in the IITG campus.

To our expectations, the 8-hour long seminar attended by many students of several schools turned out to be a power packed session of awe and learning. The all-day session was divided into three very interactive and interesting segments. The first of

these was focused on "Experimentally understanding Mathematic Principles and Concepts ". This session was focused on experimentally deriving and proving certain frequently used mathematic principles and formulae whose origins are unknown to most of us.

The second segment on "The use of Mathematics in Cryptography and Data Transmission" focused on demonstrating to us how defense organizations use mathematics to encode and decrypt confidential data. It also focused on the origins of Digital Cryptography. The session was followed by a riddling segment where the students were shown a series of puzzles and riddles and which they solved enthusiastically.

The third and the post-lunch segment was perhaps the highlight of the day.

Focused on "WOW Maths", the session's objective was to teach all students that mathematics is beautiful and magical. The presenter, Mr. Kuldeep Karwa, who is the founder of 'Edugenie' and an alumni of IITG, beautifully demonstrated how mathematics can be magical and awe striking whilst highlighting the fact that a '**WOW should always be followed by a HOW**'.

The students left the seminar satisfied and inspired. It reminded them that even though students in our country spend a large portion of their lives trying to get into an eminent institution like IIT, in the end it is all worth it.

All the students are extremely thankful to our principal Rev. Fr. George and Dr. Saurabh Basu, the event organizer for letting us avail this wonderful opportunity. A seminar like this can have a life changing impact on a student's life and we are very fortunate that this time, it did.
